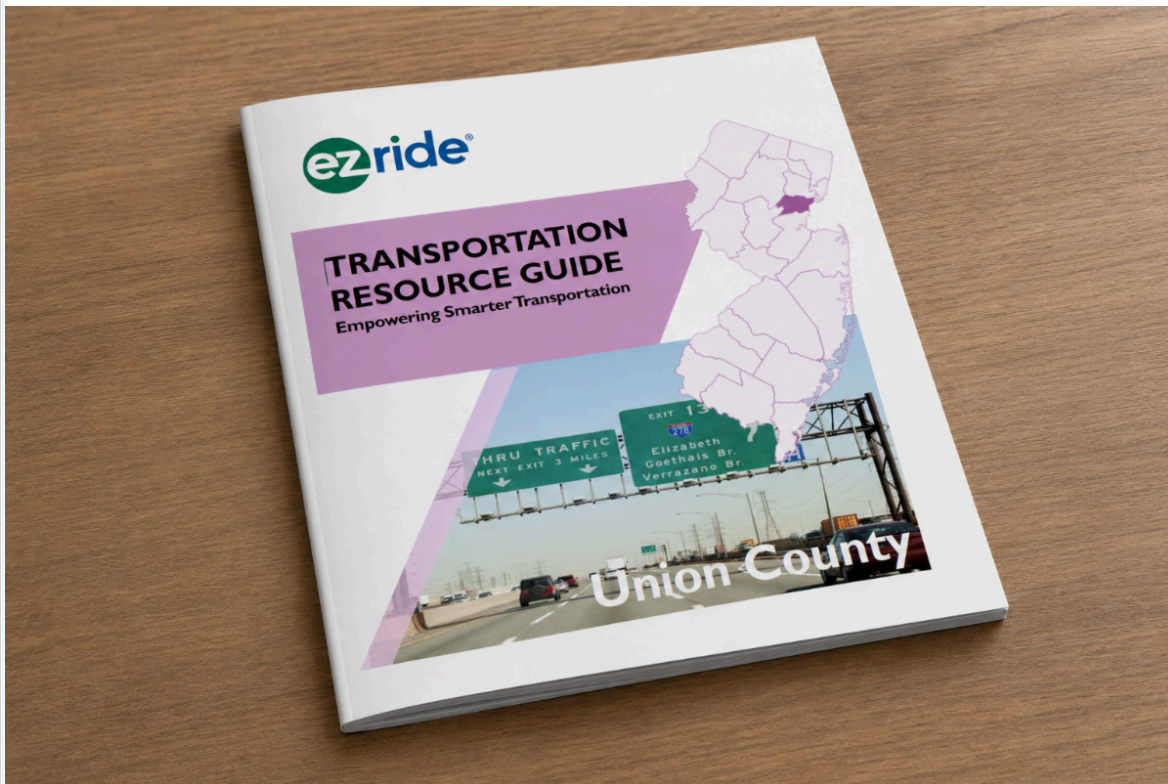


Union County Transportation Resource Guide Now Available

FIFA World Cup 2026™ Comes to New Jersey: What Residents, Commuters, and Fans Need to Know



The FIFA World Cup 2026™ is coming to East Rutherford, with matches taking place at New York New Jersey Stadium, including group stage, knockout rounds, and the Final.

Significant traffic, transit delays, and congestion are expected throughout the Meadowlands region on match days:

- **June:** 13, 16, 22, 25, 27, and 30
- **July:** 5 and 19

To help reduce congestion, commuters and non-essential travelers are encouraged to consider remote or hybrid work options during peak match days.

[Getting to the Stadium:](#) Plan Ahead

Fans are strongly encouraged to use public transit as their primary travel option. NJ TRANSIT and PATH services will provide the most reliable access to the stadium.

- Expect significant congestion throughout the region
- Plan to arrive **at least 3 hours before kickoff**.

Important: There will be **no public [parking at the stadium](#)**, and ticket holders will not be permitted to drive directly to the venue. Access to on-site parking will be restricted to credentialed vehicles only.

Accessibility

- Accessible parking is available in **Lots E, F, and G** with valid state-issued accessibility permits
- Event staff will direct vehicles to designated accessible parking areas
- An accessible drop-off location will be available in Lot C near the Verizon Gate.

Rideshare Information

- Rideshare drop-off/pick-up will be located off-site at **Meadowlands Racing and Entertainment** with pedestrian access to the stadium

- Expect surge pricing, extended wait times, and heavy congestion following matches.
- Riders are encouraged to walk away from the immediate stadium area before requesting a pickup

Additional Parking & [Stadium Shuttle Options](#)

- **American Dream Parking:** Limited parking will be available by advance reservation, with pedestrian access to the stadium. Early arrival is strongly recommended.
- **Clifton Park-and-Ride (Hackensack Meridian Health Campus):** Shuttle service will operate on match days, providing an alternative transportation option for fans.

Due to roadway restrictions and traffic control measures during FIFA World Cup 2026™ match days, the following EZ Ride services will **not operate** on:

June 16, 22, 25 and 30.

Garfield Students Take Steps to Help Older Adults Stay Connected



Transportation can be a major challenge for older adults who no longer drive, making it harder to access healthcare, grocery shopping, social activities, and other daily needs.

On May 30, the Garfield School District hosted the 2nd Annual EZ Ride Boilermaker Stride Walkathon at the GHS Track & Field to raise funds for rides for older members of the community. Held during Older Americans Month, the event brought together students, families, grandparents, and community members for a meaningful day of service and connection.

What makes the Boilermaker Stride especially meaningful is that Garfield students have embraced it as an ongoing community service initiative through a student-led club dedicated to supporting older adults. Students encouraged family members to walk alongside them, creating a meaningful intergenerational event that raised awareness and funds to help neighbors remain independent and connected to their community.

Under the leadership of Dr. Richard D. Tomko, Superintendent of the Garfield School District and EZ Ride Trustee, the walkathon demonstrates how young people can make a direct impact on the lives of local residents. Every dollar raised helps expand access to transportation and reduce barriers that often prevent older adults and people with disabilities from getting to healthcare appointments, shopping, and community activities.

“This event represents the best of Garfield, our students learning the value of service while directly improving the lives of the neighbors and families who make up our community,” said Dr. Tomko.

The success of the Boilermaker Stride reflects Garfield’s strong spirit of service and community engagement. By bringing generations together for a common cause, students are helping create a more connected, supportive, and age-friendly community for all. All the funds raised will be donated to EZ Ride to support the EZ Ryde4Life program, which uses Uber and Lyft to provide rides primarily for older adults.

ENAT Powers Up with Expanded EV Charging and Fleet Electrification Efforts



On June 2nd, [ENAT Transportation & Logistics](#) cut the ribbon on their newly installed EV Chargers at 1050 Wall Street in Lyndhurst. The company purchased and installed one dual-port Level 2 charger and three dual-port Level 3 Fast Chargers, allowing up to eight vehicles to charge at the same time. The project was supported through the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's [‘It Pay\\$ to Plug In’ grant](#) program.

To celebrate the launch, ENAT is inviting the public to charge their electric vehicles at the site free of charge through June 30. The company will also make the chargers available at no cost to other tenants in the corporate plaza.

ENAT delivers retail products and medical supplies and provides catering and passenger transportation for corporate events. The company serves small- to medium-sized businesses in Bergen, Hudson, Essex, and Middlesex counties in New Jersey, as well as the Bronx in New York City.

ENAT began transitioning its fleet to electric vehicles in 2022, initially charged its EVs at home and at public charging stations. As the company expanded its electric fleet, reliable charging access became increasingly important.

“We decided to purchase and install our own EV charging stations because our drivers often had to wait to charge, and it was affecting our business operations,” said Luis Abad, Head of Business Operations, ENAT Transportation & Logistics.

To date, ENAT has transitioned five of its seven delivery vehicles to EVs. The company has also applied for an [NJ ZIP grant](#) from the New Jersey Economic Development Authority to purchase 10 [Chevrolet BrightDrop](#) cargo vans to expand its operations.

Roselle Park Tests New Ways to Improve Safety Near Schools and Neighborhood Streets



After Roselle Park residents raised concerns about speeding, illegal turns, and poor visibility at local intersections, borough leaders responded.

This spring, the Borough of Roselle Park partnered with EZ Ride to launch a temporary demonstration project designed to improve safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists at two locations: Myrtle Avenue & West Lincoln Avenue and Hazel Street & West Roselle Avenue. The project demonstrates how communities can use low-cost, temporary improvements to test solutions before making permanent investments.

The initiative began when Fifth Ward Councilman and Council President Jay Robaina approached EZ Ride with concerns about traffic safety at the two intersections. Near EJJF Aldene Elementary School, vehicles frequently parked illegally near corners during student drop-off and pick-up times, blocking sight lines for drivers and children crossing the street. Residents also reported dangerous and illegal turns at nearby intersections, including drivers traveling the wrong way on one-way streets.

Working closely with borough officials, EZ Ride developed a demonstration plan that included painted curb extensions, directional pavement markings, and delineators designed to calm traffic, improve visibility, shorten crossing distances, and discourage illegal maneuvers. After receiving approval from the borough engineer and securing materials through the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), the project moved from concept to reality.

On June 2, 2026, EZ Ride's Bike & Pedestrian Team, with support from the Roselle Park Department of Public Works and Traffic Bureau, installed the temporary safety improvements. The project will remain in place through September, giving residents an opportunity to experience the changes and provide feedback.

Community input will play a key role in determining whether the improvements should become permanent. **Pre-** and **post-project** surveys are being conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of the changes and gather residents' perspectives.

“Real community safety relies on strong partnerships and active residents,” said Councilman Robaina. “Thanks to the generosity and expertise of EZ Ride and the NJTPA, Roselle Park was able to turn resident feedback into immediate action. These curb extensions are proven safety measures that will protect pedestrians and calm traffic where it matters most.”

Roselle Park's willingness to test innovative solutions demonstrates how communities can address safety concerns quickly, collaboratively, and cost-effectively.
