Two Foundations Award \$17,000 for the *Ryde4Life* Program

n October, EZ Ride was the proud recipient of two grants for the Investors Ryde4Life program. Foundation, which was created by Investors Bank in 2005 to support the communities the bank serves, awarded a \$5,000 grant to EZ Ride in furtherance of its mission to support human services initiatives. Additionally, The Caleb C. Pruden Trust, which was established under the last will and testament of Mr. Pruden, awarded EZ Ride a \$12,000 grant for its Ryde4Life program. Mr. Pruden's desire was to alleviate the sufferings and promote the welfare of blind persons residing in his native city, Elizabeth, NJ.

We are excited about the support that we have received in the last 12 months from several foundations including the Walmart Foundation, Wallerstein Foundation and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to provide transportation services for older adults using the *Ryde4Life* program.

The *Ryde4Life* program provides rides for adults 18 years or older in partnership with Lyft. Rides are provided for members on demand with no advance reservation requirements. Riders do not need a smartphone and simply call a toll free number to request a ride. EZ Ride coordinators monitor the ride and assist, if required.

Maywood Avenue Elementary School – Pedal with the Police Neighborhood Bike Ride

n Friday, October 19, 2018, officers from the Maywood Police Department, members of EZ Ride's bike and pedestrian team, and more than 30 student cyclists gathered in front of Maywood Avenue Elementary School to take part in the 'Pedal with the Police' neighborhood bike ride. The students braved the brisk 30-degree weather as Officer Erik Aronson led the group on a planned three-mile ride around the Borough of Maywood to celebrate Walk and Bike to School Month.

Officer Aronson reviewed the basic safety rules, EZ Ride staff helped to fit and adjust students' helmets, and other police officers helped to inflate tires, then we began our ride! Several police officers in patrol cars led the bicycle riders, blocked traffic and also followed the group to ensure safety. The EZ Ride team rode with the students to help and encourage them to complete the ride – for some it was their longest and most challenging ride.

After the long ride, the children enjoyed snacks and drinks courtesy of Officer Aronson, the Police distributed lights and bells, and the EZ Ride team provided bike safety activity books and helmets.

Officer Aronson says "In the last few years, attendance at our Bicycle Rodeos

has continued to improve. They have been successful and enjoyable events, thanks to the assistance of the schools, EZ Ride, and the Safe Kids program.

"However, in the past, the rodeos were conducted at an outdoor basketball court, and there was a lot of interest in riding in the streets.

"In conjunction with our school's Bike to School Friday and October being Walk and Bike to School Month, we wanted to expand our community policing outreach by providing children the opportunity to ride safely in our community with our bicycle patrol and to review the rules of the road. 'Pedal with the Police' was a perfect name for our event.

"We have received encouraging feedback about this particular event. Besides holding another Bicycle Rodeo in the spring, we are hoping to hold another 'Pedal with the Police' event in the future."

Ryde4Life Program Provides the Answer to Prevent Senior Isolation

aging without a spouse or family member at their side, without friends to help them laugh at the ridiculous parts and support them through the difficult times. Yet, that is just what many seniors face. As the baby boomer generation crosses the over-65 threshold, many of our aging loved ones are still feeling alone in the crowd.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau 11 million, or 28 percent of people aged 65 and older, lived alone at the time of the census. As people get older, their likelihood of living alone only increases. Additionally, more and more older adults do not have children, reports the AARP, and that means fewer family members to provide company and care as those adults become seniors. While living alone does not inevitably lead to social isolation, it is certainly a predisposing factor. Yet another important consideration is how often seniors engage in social activities.

More than 40 million people who are 65 and older carry a drivers' license. But driving is more than just a passion or a pastime: it's a lifeline. Studies show that giving up driving increases a person's mortality risk and makes seniors more likely to land in nursing homes and suffer from depression. Yet the average American man outlives his ability to drive by six years; the average American woman, by 10 years.

Ocean Community Economic Action Now, Inc. (O.C.E.A.N., Inc.), a nonprofit agency that works with different communities in New Jersey and assists seniors and low-income families to live better lives, has teamed up with Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey and EZ Ride to launch it's Senior Isolation Prevention Program. Ocean County is home to the largest number of seniors in New Jersey.

obody relishes the prospect of Channell Wilkins, CEO and Chief Creative Officer of O.C.E.A.N., Inc. says, "The problem is that seniors have very limited and difficult transportation options. Almost three-quarters seniors live in areas with few—if any transportation alternatives, which means their options for remaining mobile begin and end in their own driveway. We have decided to partner with Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey and EZ Ride and take advantage of their Ryde4Life program to provide free rides for seniors and help them to be more active, get to the doctor appointments or just attend social activities. The goal is simple – help seniors to be engaged and live longer, happier lives."

> According to Lynette Whiteman, Executive Director of Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey, "This option will be a such an added bonus to the seniors we assist. Our volunteers provide medical transportation which is greatly needed. Adding the opportunity to spend time with friends, attend religious services or even visit with a loved one in a Nursing Home will greatly help reduce feelings of isolation. We are very grateful to O.C.E.A.N. and EZRide for this partnership."

> Currently more than 700 members participate in the EZ Ride's Ryde4Life program, and we are looking forward to working with O.C.E.A.N and their clients. The Ryde4Life program was designed to bridge the digital divide for the older population and EZ Ride's partnership with Lyft allows users without a smartphone to schedule rides on demand. The service is available seven days a week.

EZ Ride Provides Transportation for UPS Workers During the Holiday Season

he world of night-shift workers is invisible to most people but many vital services run around the clock. For delivery companies like UPS and FedEx, life does not stop at 5 p.m. Many of the jobs are entry-level positions and are inaccessible to potential employees without a car. Public transit is unavailable or very limited during overnight hours.

And the holiday season poses additional challenges for UPS as the number of packages handled daily increase from 15.8 million to a peak of 28 million. Nationwide, UPS will hire about 100,000 temporary employees for the crucial holiday season beginning in November. Peak season begins on Black Friday, the day after the Thanksgiving holiday in November, and runs through early January when there is a large wave of returns.

Several UPS locations in New Jersey use EZ Ride shuttle service to help their employees overcome the transportation barrier to employment.

EZ Ride dispatches a fleet of six or more minibuses around midnight providing more than a dozen trips every night that link locations such as Staten Island and Edison, East Orange and Parsippany, Edison and Cranbury, and Trenton and Monroe. More than a 100 employees use the service and both the ridership and the number of trips continue to grow. Managing this service is complex as routes and schedules change often, and an acute shortage of drivers poses an additional challenge.

EZ Ride is well positioned to serve this market as we already operate night services using about 10 minibuses that serve Essex County as well as to a lesser extent Union County. More than 400 riders use our service daily – all seven days of the week.
