## Meadowlink Becomes **Transportation Provider for DDD**

n a decision that will provide reliable, easy-to-access transportation for many of New Jersey's residents with reduced mobility, Meadowlink was recently designated as a "Qualified Provider" by the New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD). "We are very pleased to be able to provide access to our Flex-T service to clients of DDD," says Meadowlink Chairman Perry Frenzel. "These New Jerseyans will be able to immediately take advantage of our established highquality transportation service."

The DDD provides public funding for services that assist adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live as independently as possible. Each person who uses DDD's services has a plan of care developed with their support coordinator that details how they want to live; their transportation needs are described in the document.

Meadowlink will be working closely with DDD clients and their support coordinators to ensure that they are getting the transportation to which they are entitled. Clients are allowed to use Flex-T for non-medical transportation such as communitybased services, integrated employment and employment-like activities such as volunteer or internship positions that may lead to employment.

## Physical Therapy Practice in Holmdel Signs Up with Flex-T

any people undergoing physical therapy have a limited range of movement that often affects their ability to drive. This makes them appropriate clients for Flex-T, our car service for people with reduced mobility. The question is: how to find these potential clients and educate them about the advantages of our service? The answer: reach them at the place they are taking their therapy.

In that spirit, Meadowlink has signed a contract with All Care Physical Therapy of Holmdel to provide transportation service for their patients on an as-needed basis. We are waiving the per-person membership fee and the practice is paying a corporate membership fee. This is helpful since many people take physical therapy for short periods of time and may be reluctant to pay an annual fee.

"Many of our patients cannot drive and have to rely on family or friends for rides or take a taxi, which can be quite expensive," said Dr. Dov Iwaniski of All Care. "We think that Flex-T will provide an excellent alternative form of transportation. We are pleased to offer access to this service to our patients."

All-Care Physical Therapy is a state of the art facility, owned and operated by a doctor of physical therapy. Its location in Monmouth County is less than 5 miles away from Holmdel, Middletown, Hazlet, Colts Neck, Keansburg, Marlboro, Manalapan, Matawan, Old Bridge, Aberdeen, and Keyport.

## Affordable Shuttle Services Ease Commuter Woes in the Meadowlands

eadowlink's EZ Ride shuttles more serve than 1.000 commuters every day in the Meadowlands area. During peak commuting hours, our shuttles pick up and drop off passengers at the Secaucus Junction train station about every five minutes. Eleven of NJ TRANSIT's thirteen train lines run through this station and many of the passengers on those trains use an EZ Ride shuttle to complete their daily commute. Additionally, EZ Ride shuttles also bring passengers to the busy Rutherford and Lyndhurst train stations.

Increasingly, commuters are looking to avoid the stress of dealing with rush hour traffic every morning and evening. EZ Ride provides a link between hundreds of Meadowlands workplaces and key public transit hubs like Secaucus, Rutherford and Lyndhurst making it easier than ever to use public transportation.

EZ Ride operates about 30 mini-buses and facilitates the commute for thousands of employees from more than 300 companies. Our fleet uses state-of-the-art technology including GPS, in-vehicle cameras and software to track scheduling and dispatching.

As the economic recovery gains momentum, companies are adding employees and seeking new locations. Introducing a shuttle service at a new location is a great way to assist employees since they have not yet settled into familiar commuting patterns. If your business is in the Meadowlands or nearby, chances are that we can add you to an existing route at less than half the cost of starting an employee shuttle from scratch.

In recent years quite a few of our shuttles have added stops at multi-unit residential properties. More and more we are serving Meadowlands residents who work in Manhattan or other locations easily accessed from the Secaucus, Lyndhurst and Rutherford stations. The reliable EZ Ride shuttle provides a vital link to key transportation hubs.

## **Meadows Office Complex Commute Fair Generates 26 New Carpoolers**

printing out of the gate for 2015, Meadowlink signed up 26 new carpoolers at the first Commute Fair of the year on January 14. Onyx Equities, property management of the complex, invited us present to about 100 employees from a number of the companies that have offices in the buildings.

Sony Entertainment and Shiseido - the skincare, makeup and fragrance company – are among the firms that have recently moved into the complex. Relocated companies are often good prospects for carpooling since the workers haven't yet settled into a commuting routine. Indeed, half of those signing up for carpools were from these two companies; other new signees included employees from Malo

Ambulatory Surgery Center, Sprint and Cancer Genetics Inc.

The Meadows Office Complex is located at the intersection of Routes 3 and 17 in Rutherford, near major highways and public transportation hubs. We already complete the commute for employees at the Meadows Office Complex to and from Secaucus with an EZ Ride shuttle that operates every half-hour five days a week from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. and again from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

# **CentraState Medical Center: 93 Employees Register for Carpooling**

eadowlink held its 157th Commute Fair of the year in November at CentraState Medical Center in Freehold and a whopping 93 commuters signed up for carpooling. CentraState is located 12 miles from exit 8A of the New Jersey Turnpike and just a few miles from Routes 9, 18 and 33. Proximity to main thoroughfares makes carpooling easier since riders can be picked up and dropped off at parking lots along the roads.



## **Protect Your Bike!**

ycling can save the world! OK, that may be a bit of an exaggeration, but according to the Pedestrian and Bicycling Information Center, the health benefits of regular physical activity include reduced risk of coronary heart disease, stroke, diabetes and other chronic diseases, reduced health care costs and improved quality of life for people of all ages. The Center reminds us that physical activity doesn't need to be very strenuous for an individual to reap significant health benefits. Even bicycling or walking for about 30 minutes a day will produce measurable benefits among those who are least active.

Not only does getting more people on their bikes have a positive impact on health, but it has environmental benefits too. The U.S. Census estimates that about half of all Americans live within five miles of their workplace. Those who decide to bike those 5 miles every day rather than driving an average car could reduce total household emissions by six percent. And did you know that you can fit up to 12 bikes in the parking space of one car?

At Meadowlink, we want to encourage cycling as a means of transportation. This is why we provide access to bike lockers at the Cranford, Rahway, Roselle Park, Summit, Maplewood, and Westfield stations. Bike lockers provide high security bike storage. It is an opportunity to park your bike over a long period of time with protection from inclement weather, theft and vandalism.

There is a \$50 refundable key deposit and \$7.50 + tax per month rental fee. It is a small price to pay for some peace of mind and dependability from a durable locker.
