Real Time Shuttle Information Now Available at EZ Ride

ith our new GPS tracking solutions, shuttle riders can get real-time Expected Time of Arrival (ETA) updates for every shuttle at all stops on their smartphones. The information is updated every 30 seconds, and the service is available for all our fixed route services which could benefit our 2,000 daily riders. The beta version is available at bus.ezride.org. The data is displayed only when the shuttle is in operation. For routes that are served by more than one vehicle, the information for each bus is presented separately. A different color is used for each bus, and they are displayed one after the other.

The ETA information is provided using real time traffic and weather information which could always change. Riders are therefore requested to budget additional time to cater for these unforeseen changes while planning their trips. And we encourage all our passengers to follow us on Twitter @myezride where we post updates on shuttle services affected by weather, traffic or other conditions.

EZ Ride works with an experienced vendor who specializes in bus wraps which are mounted using a quality vinyl and laminate. You have the flexibility to create your own design and we take care of the rest. Typically, it costs about \$2,500 - \$3,000 for the installation of the bus wrap and a monthly fee of about \$500.

800 Riders Use the *Ryde4Life*Transportation Program to Get Around

ransportation is a concern for older adults who do not drive a car and do not have easy access to public transportation. EZ Ride's *Ryde4Life* program offers on-demand transportation for adults 18 years or older in partnership with Lyft. Our members do not need a smartphone – just any cell phone to call one of our coordinators and request a ride. And, our coordinators monitor the trip and stand ready to assist if needed. EZ Ride launched the program in April 2017, and more than 800 riders in New Jersey use the service today.

Riders pay the Lyft fee plus an administrative fee of \$2.50. Not everybody can afford to pay the full cost of the ride. Those with a Pharmaceutical Assistance for Aged and Disabled (PAAD) card receive a discount of \$1 per trip. And, we have partnered with many organizations to introduce the program to their members and take advantage of the subsidies offered by them.

- 1. Affordable Housing Alliance (AHA) of Monmouth County AHA members use the service to access jobs, healthcare, shopping or attend schools. A dedicated transportation account for up to \$1,000 is set up for each AHA client to help pay for the service. Clients can request transportation to any location in New Jersey.
- 2. Ocean Community Economic Action Now, Inc. (O.C.E.A.N.) OCEAN's Senior Isolation Prevention program is designed to encourage seniors in Ocean County to use our transportation services to be more active, get to the medical appointments or to attend social events.
- 3. Township of Montclair The Township will sponsor membership for the first 100 Montclair residents over the age of 55 years and a thirty-five dollar

ransportation is a concern for older credit for rides to encourage residents to adults who do not drive a car and take advantage of the *Ryde4Life* program.

- 4. The city of Garfield The Garfield Health Department launched a pilot program that offers free non-emergency trips to qualified residents. The City coordinates all requests for rides.
- 5. Essex County The County provides free transportation services using the *Ryde4Life* program for residents who cannot be transported by the County's Special Transportation System. The County's Special Transportation Operator Transdev, will provide a list of clients who need transportation and EZ Ride will provide the service using Lyft.
- 6. Asbury Park Alliance Thanks to a generous grant from the New Jersey Health Initiative, the statewide grantmaking wing of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, EZ Ride provides up to \$100 worth of rides for older adults in Asbury Park.

Michael Vieira, Director, Special Transportation Services for Essex County, says, "My primary goal in Essex County is to provide reliable transportation for our seniors. Sometimes, it is a challenge to provide transportation when all the resources are committed, and flexibility is non-existent. In those circumstances, I know I can count on EZ Ride and the Ryde4Life program to provide us that added flexibility to ensure we can continue to serve our riders at a nominal cost without disrupting our other services."

Bloomfield's Watsessing School Goes for the Gold

Watsessing School is participating in the Safe Routes to School Recognition Program and has been nominated for the "Gold" award. The school embarked on a series of initiatives including Pedestrian Safety Presentations (PSP) at the school.

We taught the kids the four safety rules - STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and THINK using hand gestures. We emphasized the importance of stopping completely before crossing in the crosswalk, looking left, right and left before crossing. We told them listening and being alert is important for pedestrians and drivers, and why headphones can be distracting. Lastly, we talked about getting the attention of drivers by wearing bright clothing and waving to them before crossing the street.

We also asked several students to come up and demonstrate their safety rules on our roadway. We reinforced our presentations by distributing walking safety bookmarks and involving students in a safety poster contest to earn safety prizes.

Dr. Gina Rosamilia, the Principal, said, "The materials presented were age

appropriate and very relevant. Students were engaged in practicing the safety rules which will assist them in the future. The four walking safety rules are a great strategy and an excellent way to help the students remember the program."

The 5th and 6th graders created original safety comic strips as part of a second contest. The winner will get a FitBit from EZ Ride's Get Active NJ grant.

Athena Giordano, a teacher, said, "EZ Ride's presentation was extremely informative for our students who learned a great deal about what to look out for and how to be safe coming to and from school. The students also enjoyed relaying the messages to their parents and guardians because it applies to them.

Creating a poster or comic strip is a useful tool to ensure the students grasped the lessons taught. We were delighted with the presentation and believe it has increased our students' awareness about walking safety."
