- 4. Collect small figurines and toys you have at home you wish to use (lego people, dolls, hot wheels cars, trucks, school buses, bikes,trees, RR tracks, etc)
- 5. Find something to use as your base that will fit your toys (lego base, shoebox, flat piece of cardboard, etc)
- 6. Paint or draw roads, sidewalks, bike lanes. You can also use paper cut outs to make roads, crosswalks, and sidewalks that can be moved around.
- 7. Make and add small trees, houses, shrubs and small safety signs (Stop, Ped. Crossing, School Zone, 25 mph Speed Limit)
- 8. Enjoy playing with your homemade walking or biking safety diorama
