In recognition of your outstanding dedication and contributions to our bicycle, pedestrian, and driver safety programs.



William M. Yarzab Senior Planner, Safety New Jersey Transportation Planning Authority

William (Will) Yarzab is a Senior Planner at the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), where he oversees the statewide Street Smart NJ pedestrian safety program. Since 2014, Will has led more than 280 Street Smart campaigns and has connected EZ Ride to over 150 municipalities and police departments, significantly advancing local traffic safety efforts.

In his role, Will recruits new campaign partners and provides support to municipalities, colleges, police departments, and other organizations participating in the initiative. His leadership has been instrumental in expanding Street Smart's reach and impact across New Jersey.

Before joining NJTPA, Will served the Randolph Township Police Department and the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office, retiring as a Lieutenant after 22 years of service. During his law enforcement career, he served as a patrol officer, detective, traffic safety supervisor, supervisor of records and training, and co-manager for the department's New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police (NJSACOP) Law Enforcement Accreditation.

Will also championed teen driver safety in Randolph, helping bring the "Alive at 25" program to the community and coauthoring a practical how-to guide for municipalities seeking to implement it.

Michael Vieira has served as Director of Special Transportation Services for Essex County for more than 36 years. In this role, he oversees community transportation programs that serve senior citizens, individuals with disabilities, and economically disadvantaged residents.

He is President of the New Jersey Council on Special Transportation and an active member of the Community Transportation Association of America, where he shares his expertise with transportation agencies nationwide.

In addition to his professional work, Mr. Vieira serves on the Livingston Township Council, where he has been a member since 2019. He has also contributed to numerous local initiatives, including the Livingston Transportation Advisory Committee, Vision 20/20, Complete Streets, the Bi-Partisan Advisory Committee on Appointments, and the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

Mr. Vieira represents Essex County on the EZ Ride Board of Trustees and is also a member of the Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs. He is a graduate of Rutgers University–Newark.

Shelley Brindle is the Mayor of the Town of Westfield, New Jersey, first elected in 2017 and reelected in 2021. In her eight years as mayor, Mayor Brindle co-founded the Raritan Valley Line Mayors' Alliance; serves as the 2nd Vice President of the NJ League of Municipalities (NJLM) and the Chair of the NJLM's Liquor License Reform Task Force; led Westfield's sustainability efforts resulting in first-time Silver Certification award by Sustainable Jersey; achieved first-time state professional accreditation for the Westfield Police Department; was named 2022 Mayor of the Year by the Gateway Regional Chamber of Commerce; and was previously awarded the Innovation in Governance Award by NJLM and the DCA.

Previously, Mayor Brindle served as HBO's Executive Vice President, Domestic Network Distribution & Marketing, where she oversaw HBO's \$4.5B domestic subscription business and the launch of its first streaming service.

Mayor Brindle currently serves on the Board of Directors at Philo, a San Francisco-based streaming TV service; the Board of Directors for W.O.M.E.N. In America (WIA), an executive women's mentoring organization; is a founding member of Extraordinary Women on Boards (EWOB); serves as an advisor and mentor to the University of Chicago's Leadership & Society Initiative and the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy at her alma mater, the University of Virginia.

Mayor Brindle and her husband Kip are 30-year residents of Westfield where they have raised their three children, and currently have four rescue dogs and any number of foster dogs waiting for their forever homes.

Martin Ceperley SOMa Bike Bus Maplewood

Martin Ceperley is a dad of three and resident of Maplewood, trained as a photojournalist and working in technology. After observing many collisions on the road in front of his home and experiencing dangerous conditions riding his bike around town, he began advocating for safer road design and bike infrastructure in Maplewood.

In 2024 he co-founded SOMa Bike Bus with other local parents as a fun and healthy way for kids to get to school together, to build community, and to get more people outside biking safely in often unsafe road conditions. The Bike Bus has grown to have weekly routes on Fridays at 5 of 6 district elementary schools, and just started its second school year with over 400 families participating. It serves as a community hub, leading social rides for families and grown-ups, charity rides, and hosting bike swap events to get more kids on bikes.

The township of Maplewood recently approved its first bike lane to Columbia High School on Parker Ave, slated to be constructed later this year. Martin creates videos around biking, advocacy and the bike bus on Instagram @maplewoodbikelanes and @somabikebus.
