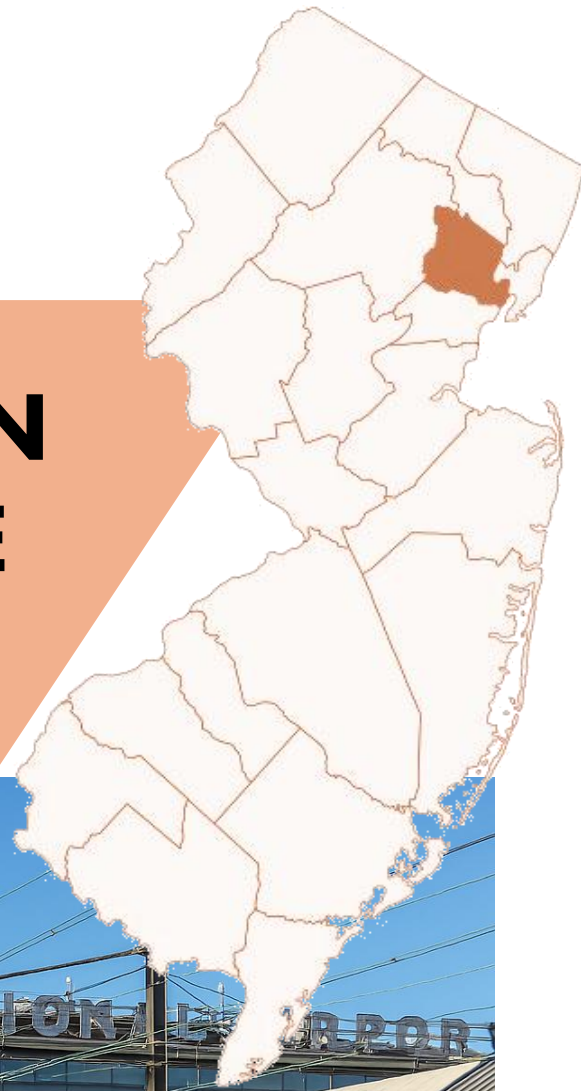

Special Transportation

[Essex County Community Transportation](#) provides free transportation services for older adults and individuals with disabilities who require non-emergency rides. The program ensures access to medical appointments, shopping, and various community programs.

- Service is available for individuals over 60 years of age and disabled adults
- Transportation provided for non-emergency medical and therapy appointments
- Trip reservations must be made at least two business days in advance.
- Riders are asked to be ready one hour before scheduled pick-up or drop-off times.
- For more info call the Essex County Division of Senior Services Transportation Administrator at ☎ (973) 737-7200 between 9:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M., Monday through Friday to reserve a trip or to inquire about monthly scheduled trips to other destinations.
- Flexibility Required: Due to high demand, passengers may need to be flexible with pick-up days and times. Vehicles are handicapped-equipped and arm assistance is provided.

EZ Ryde4Life – Rides with Lyft and Uber

Essex County, in partnership with EZ Ride, provides free rides through the EZ Ryde4Life program, which uses Lyft and Uber to deliver transportation for approved trips.

- Advanced approval is required by contacting the Essex County Special Transportation: ☎ (973) 737-7200
- Once approved, riders contact EZ Ride at ☎ (201) 939-4242, **Option 4** to schedule a trip.

Rides are available Monday – Friday from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. and on Saturday from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

Road to Recovery Program



The program uses volunteer drivers to offer free transportation exclusively for cancer patients who need assistance getting to and from their medical appointments, including chemotherapy, radiation, or follow-up visits.

- The service availability depends on the number of volunteer drivers in your area.
- Patients must call ahead to schedule rides – same day requests may not be possible
- Formal account is not required, but information such as diagnosis, treatment, location and appointment details will be needed

VA's Veterans Transportation Program (VTP) offers Veterans many travel solutions to and from their VA health care facilities. This program offers these services at little or no cost to eligible Veterans.

Services

- Once your VA facility creates your account, you can use the VetRide portal to request rides.
- Rides can be requested via phone, online portal, or [VetRide mobile app](#).
- Trips must be for a VA-authorized medical appointment.
- Veterans who are eligible for VA health care benefits and have an appointment authorized by VA are automatically eligible for transportation through the VTS program.

1. Transportation by Train



Essex County is served by several train lines. All train lines converge at Newark Penn Station, one of NJ TRANSIT's major transit hubs, offer convenient connections and seamless transfers to additional NJ TRANSIT lines, including direct routes into New York City and beyond.

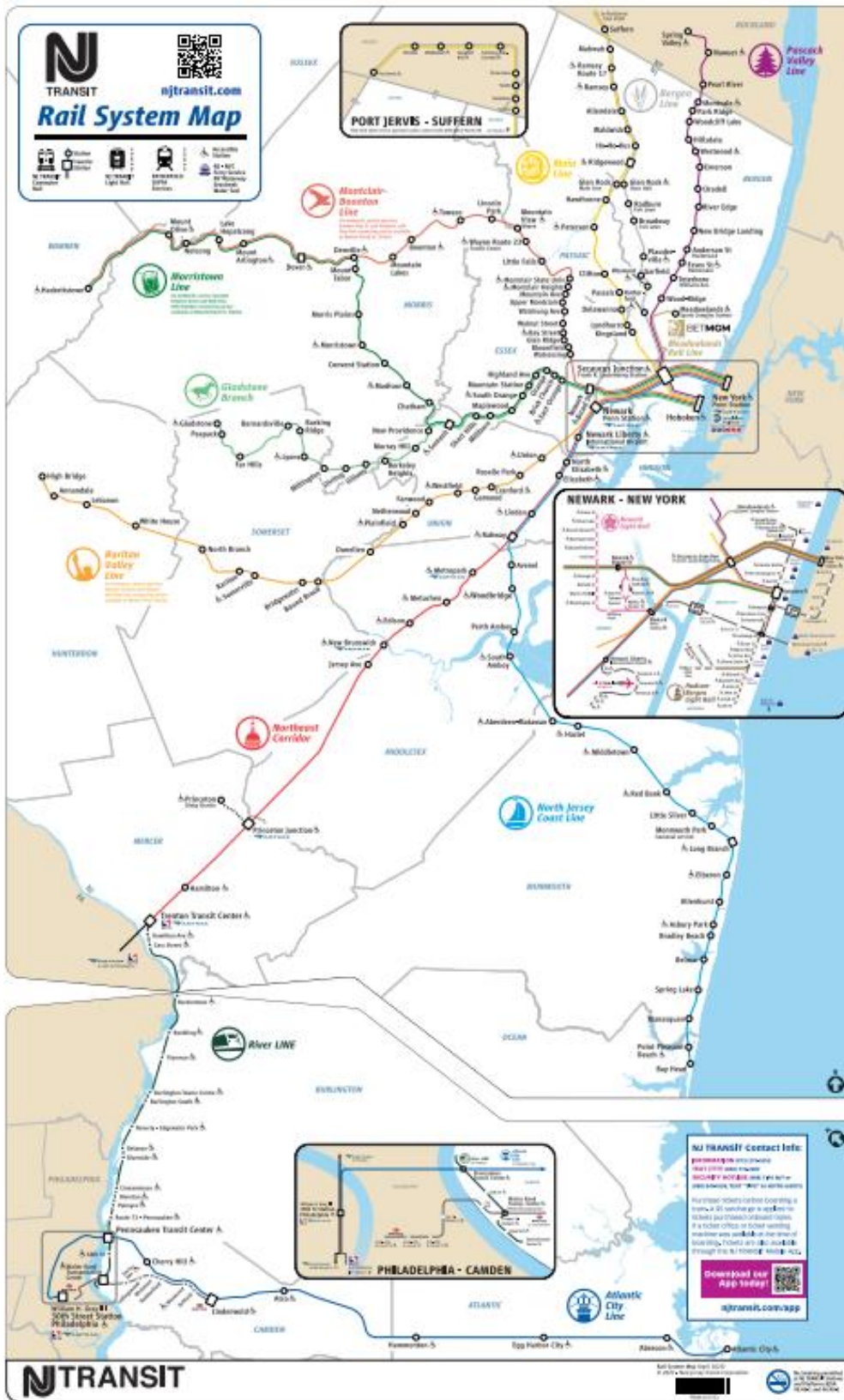

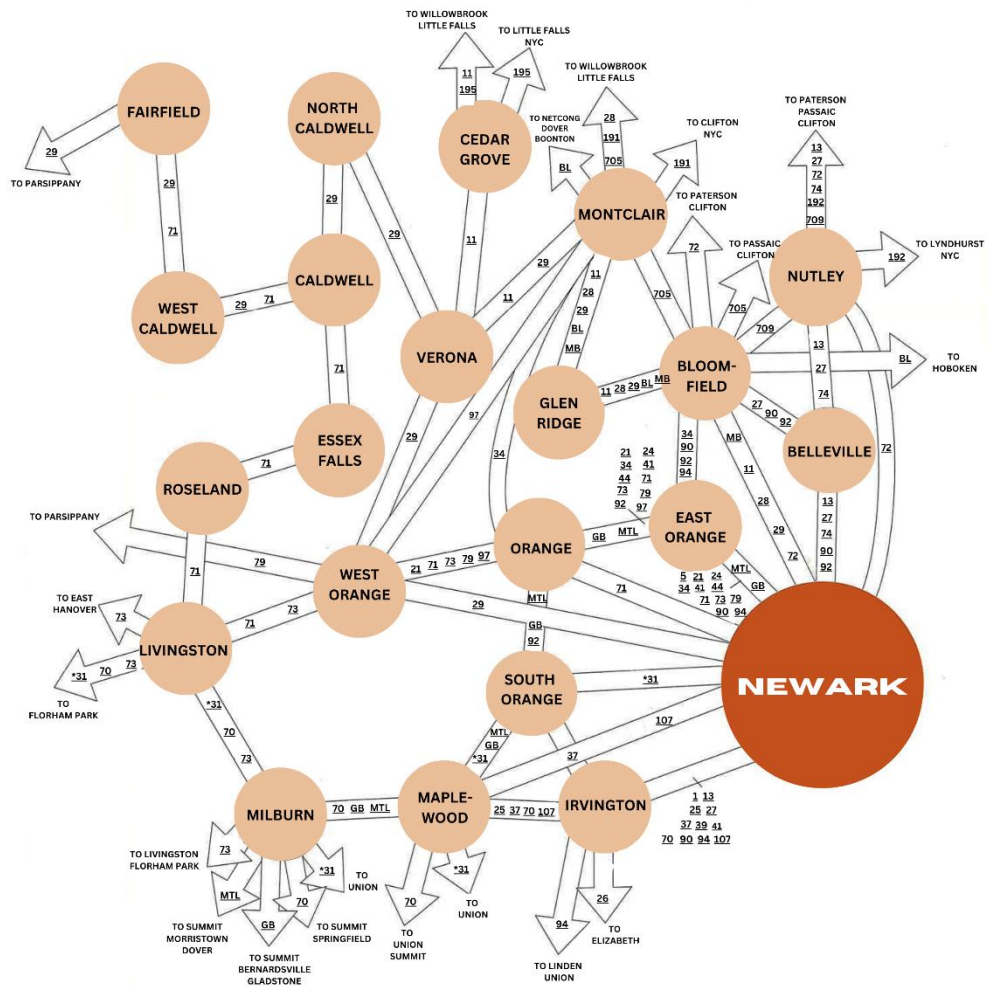

- Curb-to-curb wheelchair accessible transportation service for individuals with disabilities who cannot use regular fixed-route buses.
- Access Link service is comparable to the bus in that it is available during the same days and hours as the regularly scheduled local fixed route bus service, including weekends and holidays.

Key Features

- **Curb-to-curb Service** - Shared ride transportation with pick-up and drop-off points located within 3/4 of a mile of a fixed bus route or light rail station.
- **Pick-Up Timeframe** - Drivers operate within a 20-minute window before or after the scheduled pick-up time.
- **Types of Trips** - Access Link can be used for medical, social, recreational, shopping, and other travel purposes.

13. Bikes on Buses & Trains



NJ TRANSIT provides cyclists with a convenient and flexible way to travel across New Jersey, seamlessly combining bike, bus, and train options. Whether commuting, exploring, or choosing an eco-friendly trip, knowing how to bring your bike along can make your journey easier and more enjoyable.

Bikes on Buses

- Get your bike and gear ready as the bus approaches.
- Signal the driver that you'll be using the bike rack once the bus stops.
- Use one hand to lower the rack and the other to lift your bike onto it.
- Place the tires in the slots labeled "front" and "back."
- Pull the support bar over the front tire to secure the bike.
- Before getting off, let the driver know you'll be unloading your bike.
- When unloading, release the support bar, remove your bike, and fold the rack back up.

Bikes on Trains

- Foldable bicycles are permitted on all NJ TRANSIT trains at all times.
- Standard bicycles are not permitted on weekday peak-direction trains:
 - **Inbound trains arriving in Newark, Hoboken, or New York 6:00–10:00 A.M.**
 - **Outbound trains departing Newark, Hoboken, or New York 4:00–7:00 P.M.**
- Use designated bike areas, usually located in ADA-accessible sections near the doors.
- Wheelchair users have priority in these spaces.
- Secure your bike to keep it stable during the trip.

Bikes on PATH Trains

- For those looking to transport their bicycles via PATH train, different equipment and loading procedures are in place.
- Folded bicycles are permitted on PATH at all times, with a limit of two bikes per car.
- Electric bicycles (e-bikes) and electric scooters are not allowed on PATH trains at any time
- Non-folding bicycles are permitted except for the rush hour periods of 6:30-9:30 a.m. and 3:30-6:30 p.m. Bicycles are not permitted in the first railcar of a train.
